- The written melody for this tune is inspired by Mr. Ferret's vocal performance from the album Ou Welto Risella.

Naturally, there are slight variations in pitch and rhythm each A section.e.g. the last note, of the 3rd bar, of the first A section, I believe, is a G natural... but because it's an E natural on every other A section, it is notated as such. Like always, to get a more
